





Tiger volleyball has new look, same motivation

Summer open gyms and two weeks of practice wrapped up for the Paris Volleyball program. All three squads (fresh/soph, junior varsity and varsity) will begin their seasons on the road with trips to Broadlands and Cayuga.

The outlook has boiled to this point just as Head Coach Clay Bess anticipated; returning Lady Tigers are claiming their spots in the starting lineups, but incoming Lady Tigers are making a strong case for playing younger talent.

That is the main reason Coach Bess kept 16 freshmen in the program.

"We have excellent talent in our older group. Enough talent to win. But we also have very skilled and eager underclassmen who are going to settle in at some point this

season," said Bess. "It's going to be a blend of the two groups that help our JV and Varsity teams excel when we need them to."

Experienced talent will fill the varsity starting lineup on opening night. Senior Aubree Leader will be the main offensive threat for a Lady Tiger team who will rely on defense and discipline. Leader will play the six rotation this season. This is a new role for her, but one she is prepared for, especially from the service line.

Jami Wallace is the only other returning starter, back in the middle position. Wallace will need to supply defense and is versatile enough on offense to score in multiple ways.

Seniors Maddie Ramsey and Addie Ford expect to contribute from the front row and back row, respectively. Junior setter Sam Kindred is back in the varsity lineup. Kindred saw action two years ago when Emily Wells missed time due to injury. Now, it is Kindred's offense to run.

Four juniors will round out the season's opening rotation. Annie Pruitt and Kynlee Shanks, excellent passers for the Lady Tigers, will be charged with shoring up step one of Paris' offense, a task that Coach Bess has not been shy to say is the program's weakest skill. Hailey Yantis will look to make an impact from the right pin on offense. A tri-ath-

lete last season, Peighton Smith, will start as the other middle in orange and black.

The program features one other senior, Kymberley Klyiac, and two other juniors, Linda Selimoska and Emily Fleming.

"It hink the only way to replace a 10-person senior class, and follow up an all-time successful season, is with patience," Bess explained. "We've practiced very hard the first two weeks... implemented a few systems and ideas. Now, the matches begin and we're not looking for perfection, but looking for what we need to tweak and fine-tune. The only high expectations I've set are for the end of the season. That's once we figure out who we are and who can work best together."

Paris started the season 5-1 in Bess' first season last year, before finishing 19-14, and faces the same opponents to open up 2023. The Lady Tigers open Little Illini play against Casey on Thursday, Sept. 7, in a match the team is looking forward to in light of their conference championship aspirations. Those goals undoubtedly add Mt. Carmel (Oct. 5) and Newton (Oct. 19) to the watch list. Both opponents are LIC powers and both visit Paris. Two other opponents circled on a tough slate of matches will face Paris on the road: Bismarck-Henning (Sept. 19) and Terre Haute North (Oct. 9).

Lady Tiger tennis sports reloading with younger players, new attitude

This fall marks Coach Stefan Aydt's ninth season at the helm of the PHS girls tennis program, in addition to 11 seasons of experience as the boys tennis coach. Aydt is assisted for the second straight year by 2018 PHS graduate, former tennis player and state qualifier Jacob Randolph.

The Lady Tigers need to replace a talented group of seniors who accounted for about 70% of their match victories last year, including their top doubles team, Lily Graham and Kimber Calvert, who were state qualifiers. Calvert is continuing her career at Monmouth College this season.

Paris' two returning players with significant varsity experience are juniors Emmy Barrett and Graci Watson who played #4 and #6 last year and are currently standing at #1 and #2 in the lineup, respectively. Sophomores Bella Moreschi, Myah Bartos and Shelby Fry all picked up varsity wins in limited play last year and will look to build on that experience this season. Finally, sophomore Ava Barrett will be playing #6 and looking to earn the first varsity win of her career.

The Lady Tigers return five other players along with seven first-year players for a roster of 18 girls. This year's Lady Tiger squad is young - Kendel Whitehead (a first-year player) is the only senior.

"We're definitely focusing on skill development this season," Aydt explained. "And hoping to learn quickly as we get into our early matches.

Typically, Aydt's goals include finishing in the top half of every tournament we play, having a winning record in duals and qualifying someone for the state tournament. Right now, the Lady Tigers are primarily focused on improving every practice.

"I'm definitely looking forward to getting a chance to see how we match up with our usual opponents after the time our girls put in improving this summer," said Aydt. "But with the heat, it looks like we're going to have to wait a while longer on that."

As the defending LIC champion, Robinson is the conference favorite coming into the season, returning their full lineup from last season. Olney is also expected to be a strong contender as well, while Casey and Newton both return most or all of their top six. The LIC will be a strong conference again this year.

Paris hosts the LIC Tournament on Saturday, Oct. 7, preceded by the Paris Doubles Tournament on Saturday, Sept. 16. Both are tough tournaments, featuring multiple returning state qualifiers and some of the area's top teams in Robinson (both), Teutopolis (Paris Doubles), and Flora (Paris Doubles).

Titans golf small in numbers, ready for challenge

All athletic programs go through changes, including the Tri-County high school golf program. Since the Shiloh joined the Tri-County co-op in 2014, the Titans have sent three golfers to the IHSA Class 1A finals in eight years. The past couple of seasons have seen a decline in numbers, other than the 2020 COVID season where players who normally would participate in other fall sports competed due to their season being moved to the spring and shortened.

Last season, Theresa Sisk took over the reins and is back for her second season at the helm. Sisk's roster includes six golfers, three boys and three girls. While the Titans will not be able to compete as teams, they will have opportunities to compete as individuals.

Three of Sisk's six players are playing for the first time – Sisk has a game plan to assist the newcomers while keeping her returning players motivated.

"Last year, I learned that the new players need to keep their penalty strokes to a minimum," she said. "It makes a difference when you can keep the ball in play and not have to take a penalty. That is also a goal for the new players this season to keep the penalty strokes to a minimum. As for the seasoned players, they need to try and be consistent and challenge themselves to beat the score they shot the match before."

Two senior players, Kaylee Ruff and Davin Smith, return to the green for their farewell tours. Smith has been with the program all four years. Ruff has played golf all four years too, with this being her second season with Tri-County.

Sophomore Logan Gerberding also returns for his second season on the team. With Smith having the most experience and having played since he was a little boy, Sisk has acknowledged his help in assisting his teammates.

"Davin Smith of course is our leader," Sisk explained. "He has played golf since a very young age. He is also a great help in helping the others with their swings and giving them advice on the course."

Smith and Ruff are not the only seniors on the course this season – they are joined by fellow seniors Lucy Krabel and Jonika Nickles, who are playing for the first time ever. Sophomore Will Dudley is the final player of the group and is in his first season as well.

The Titans will face a formidable schedule of teams, including a new member of the Lincoln Prairie Conference in the Sullivan Redskins. The Redskins golf program is a major powerhouse in the state, with plenty of IHSA State Finals appearances under the program's belt. It is a task that Sisk sees as motivation in the future.

"It is exciting to see Sullivan join the conference," Sisk said. "It is a great opportunity to play against a program that has had success."

The Titans started the season on Monday, Aug. 21 in Tuscola at the Warriors Doubles Invitational with the duo of Ruff and Smith teaming up on the course. On Wednesday, Aug. 23, the whole team competed in a meet hosted by the Marshall Lions.

Upperclassmen leadership, talent are key for Titan volleyball teams

For the Tri-County, volleyball has been a staple of the co-op since Kansas and Oakland joined forces in 2005. The program boasts 10 regional titles, including a third-place state finish in 2012 in Class 1A.

In the past two seasons, the Titans remained competitive, but have not seen the results the program is used to, going 15-13 overall and 4-6 in the Lincoln Prairie Conference a year ago.

For the upcoming 2023-2024 season, the Titans look to rise back towards the top.

Head Coach Crystal Buckler returns for her seventh season at the helm of Tri-County volleyball and has some well-known staff members along for the ride. Three former Tri-County players are on board. Cailynne Neill, formerly Phillips, returns as an assistant coach for her second season, and is joined by first-year assistant coaches Madison Shirley and Alison Smith.

Smith just recently concluded a solid college career at Vincennes University before

transferring to Union College in Kentucky for her final two years. Neill, Shirley, and Smith were a part of the 2017 Titans team that won the Class 1A regional championship on their home court in Kansas.

24 Lady Titans will wear the Purple, Orange and Blue this season, with a varsity roster consisting of experienced returning players and a strong core of new talent.

The Lincoln Prairie Conference welcomes a new member as the Sullivan Redskins make their debut after their stint in the Central Illinois Conference. With the addition of Sullivan, the conference becomes even deeper with teams including ALAH, Heritage, Cerro Gordo-Bement, Decatur LSA and Blue Ridge becoming title contenders. Tri-County football reloads as conference expands

For the Tri-County Titans high school football team, the anticipation surrounding the upcoming season has steadily increased since April. Once the summer workouts began, a large contingent of players attended summer workouts, only feeding the team's confidence. The consistent turnout is something head coach TJ Blake hopes will turn into on-field success.

"Summer workouts went really well," Blake said. "We were able to average between 20-25 players for each of the workouts which was very promising. (It) hows how many of our guys are committed to getting better and how many are hungry for success for this coming season. We also changed up how we trained and organized each workout. We went with less overall time, but still got the same amount of work in and put a huge emphasis on getting faster as a team."

Blake returns for his second season at the helm of the Titans, coming off a 3-6 overall record and 2-5 in the Lincoln Prairie Conference last year.

This season, the stakes in conference play are even higher as two new teams join the league. The two new teams are the Sullivan-Okaw Valley Redskins, who hail from the Central Illinois Conference and the Nokomis Redskins who were previously independent.

The expansion is a challenge Blake says his team is looking forward to.

"The guys are excited for the closed schedule and the opportunity to seeing a couple new faces in the LPC in Sullivan-Okaw Valley and Nokomis," he said. "I wouldn't say that there's a sense of urgency because, as cliche as it sounds,

we take it one week at a time. As long as we handle our business and give each opponent our best effort, good things will happen and the chips will fall where they're supposed to. The goal each year is to make the playoffs and that starts with being an at-large with five wins, but six makes us guaranteed. Anything after that is icing on the cake. We believe in our guys and feel we're capable of anything."

The roster of 33 players returns a solid batch of starters from last season, but has some big shoes to fill in certain skill positions. Most of the offensive line did graduate meaning it will be up to last season's reserves to step in at certain


The line play will be led by seniors Wyatt Glibert and John Kibler and will be backed up by seniors Cole Decker, Jeremiah Evans and Wyatt Conner. Juniors Jimmy Dillon, Karsten Willison, Bryson Hudson, Grant North, Jack Houlihan and Taran Borntreger along with sophomore Aiden Loveall will give the Titans some needed depth on both sides of the ball. Kibler returns as the team's leading tackler from a year ago with

On the offensive side of the ball, the Titans will have junior Garrett Pollock behind center again after throwing for 392 yards and four touchdowns last season. The bulk of the running game from a year ago has graduated, leaving some big shoes to fill in the backfield along with passing opportunites on the outside.

Junior Caden Logan returns as the team's leading receiver, and sophomore Clay Kibler returns as the team's leading rusher and second leading receiver. The Titans are looking to seniors Alex Hoel and Justin Robertson to accomodate Logan on the edges along with junior Andy Houlihan to take the place at tight end.

Juniors Myles Watson and Donnie Loveall will give Tri-County more options in the backfield to support Kibler. Despite the holes that need to be filled, Blake is confident the fresh faces are capable of filling the void.

"We lost some major pieces last year in both the skill positions and in the trenches, but we've gotten some new faces that I believe will help alleviate some of the lost production from Gaige Cox and Tyler VonLanken graduating," Blake said "To go along with the new faces, we have some younger guys that are battling to earn their spot that are going to help us by giving us depth which we haven't had in a long while, not only in the trenches, but with our skills as well. Us coaches believe we're going to be much more well-rounded, rather than lean on just a few guys, which makes us very excited!"

"No matter what team we face, our goal is to come out with the win, as well as working on small things we know that need improvement."

The Titans are looking for some leadership from its upperclassmen with two players from last year's team looking to take that role. Seniors Josie Armstrong and Briana Reese return with the most time on the court. Armstrong was the team's setter, making the plays happen and leading the team in assists with 306 (10.9 per match) while also being one of the main defenders at the net leading the team in blocks with 71 (2.5 blocks per match).

Armstrong was also a key offensive player, finishing fourth on the team in kills (93 kills, 3.3 per match).

Reese was the main player keeping balls alive on the defensive side, leading the team in digs at 158 (5.6 digs per match). She was also the team's leading server, notching 35

aces in 28 matches.

Joining the fold with larger roles this season are seniors Sami McClain and Kaitlyn Brandenburg. Brandenburg has previous experience as a starter on the junior varsity and McClain returns after suffering an achilles injury a year ago.

Junior Amaya Duzan returns having been in the starting lineup a year ago and will be joined by fellow classmates Carleigh Clifton, Shaylun Christenberry, Lily North and Lily Brown – all of whom played as starters or reserves on the junior varsity team a year ago.

No matter what the lineup is on the court, Buckler sees the objective is clear every time the spotlight is on.

"Each player's goal is to not only make sure that they are playing at their best level of play, but also encouraging their teammates to also give 110%," Buckler said. "Our returning seniors understand what it takes to come out on top. Our expectations of them are to set good examples for the underclassmen. Like every other year, the girls have big shoes to fill. With filling in those spots, the coaching staff believes there are several girls with talent and the desire to win."

The varsity roster concludes with three talented freshman making their high school

debuts. Freshmen Brookelyn Gough, Cara Phillips, the younger sister of assistant coach Cailynne Neill, and Taylor Williams, the sister of just recently graduated player Kaylin Williams, will get some first-hand experience learning from the upperclassmen.

All three players were staples of their respective junior high programs for the past three years and will rely on their older teammates to contribute in different ways to achieve success. Despite having limited time on the court this summer, Buckler has been impressed with what she has seen during the workouts.

"The past few weeks we have had limited availability for gym time, but the days we were able to get into the gym we have seen that our fundamentals are improving, and we have a lot of talent to use this year," she said. "From the matches we've played this summer, we have seen that our upperclassmen have set a good example to our younger players by encouraging and showing them the correct skills needed for the high school level."

The season began for the Titans this week with three straight road matches – one at Oblong on Monday, Aug. 21, one at Tuscola on Aug. 22 and one at Westville on Aug. 23.
