Chrisman, Georgetown-Ridge Farm return young, motivated runners

Following a first-year campaign full of opportunities to learn and grow, Georgetown-Ridge Farm and Chrisman Cross Country Coach Seth Pearson is entering his second year at the helm with confidence.

"We were a young team, but made significant improvements throughout the season," Pearson said. "This year, we are still a very young team but have put in some work over the summer and are looking forward to competition."

Fortunately, Pearson and his roster of runners won't have to wait much longer – their first meet is the Doc Acklin Invite, hosted by Paris High School at 9 a.m. Saturday, Aug. 31, followed by the Cow Chip Classic at 9 a.m., Sep. 7 in Chrisman.

Pearson and Chrisman Cross Country fans will have their eyes locked on a pair of young athletes as the year progresses. Sophomore Aidan Morgan will look to qualify for the IHSA State Meet a second straight year after a breakout freshman season and an appearance in the 3,200-meter race.

Leah Phipps, a junior, will aim to qualify in the 800-meter race after barely missing the cut last season. According to Pearson, Phipps made "significant improvements" during her sophomore campaign.

As a group, Chrisman's strength is found in its enthusiasm according to Pearson. Even in the face of grueling training, spirits remained high.

"The team's strength is (its) morale," Pearson explained. "All of the kids on the team are really enjoying the program, which is hard to do for cross country."

Pearson and his runners will zero in on nutrition and focus on remaining healthy throughout the season to ensure the Cardinals have a shot at postseason success.



Paris Tigers counting down the days before return to the gridiron

The Paris Tiger football team will play its first game of the 2024 season on Friday, Aug. 30. A clock mounted in the team's weight room emblazoned with the words "Beat North Vermillion," the Tigers' first opponent, counts down the days, hours, minutes and seconds left before the Tigers begin their quest for gridiron glory.

For ninth-year head coach Jeremy Clodfelder, the countdown started shortly after a state tournament loss to Roxana in November 2023. For his players, preparations began in December.

"We are, like always, going through the process of getting ready to compete," Clodfelder said. "We have been at that since December 4 of last year when we began our off-season phase for this 2024 team."

Clodfelder and the Tigers are riding an impressive 2023 campaign that resulted in the team's triumphant return to the IHSA Playoffs. The Tigers' record sat at 2-3 on Sept. 22, 2023, before they went 3-1 to qualify for the postseason.

Still, last year's achievements have not satiated Paris' hunger for success. After the Roxana Shells bumped the Tigers in the first round of the IHSA 3A tourney, Clodfelder and his players want another shot.

"We are proud of the fact that we were once again able to earn our way back into the playoffs with a relatively young team," said Clodfelder, adding, "Our expectations never really change from year to year. We want to prepare in a way that gives us the best opportunity to represent our town and school with a program and team they can be proud of."

This year, part of that preparation includes incorporating a faster style of play called sprint-based football, a philosophy that prioritizes speed at every position.

"We've always done a version of it," Clodfelder explained in a previous interview. "But after the playoff loss (to Roxana), we realized we need to be faster at all positions."

Beyond the X's and O's, Clodfelder wants his squad to seek success in the little things.

"(Success requires) a number of things, from preparation to discipline to staying in the moment and really attacking the process each and every day," he explained.

Many of the players implementing Clodfelder's various schemes and plays are returners from last year's squad. Now with more in-game experience from top to bottom, the Tigers will look to improve on last year's performance.

"We obviously have several positions back with some valuable experience. So in short, we have some veterans in every position group with the exception of our specialists," he said. "However, even some of those veterans are still underclassmen and have to continue to grow."

Clodfelder and his staff look forward to showcasing the hard work of each of their players.

"We have so many guys that deserve to be mentioned for what we feel like they can accomplish, to the way they have worked in terms of preparation for this year," he explained. "Right now we are really focused on (the) team. There will certainly be a time for that (individual recognition) as we begin to play."

Many of the Tigers' opponents this year are familiar foes, including talented squads from Mt. Carmel and Charleston. While it can be tempting to look ahead at games coming down the pipeline, the Tigers are careful not to get ahead of themselves.

"Obviously there are rivalry games, but to us all of them are important. We try and get them (players) to focus and be where their feet are," Clodfelder remarked. "This game week one is the biggest for us right now and when it gets right down to it, today is the most important day, because we have an opportunity to improve today."

While the Tigers' season opens on Aug. 30, they will have to wait until Friday, Sept. 13 to take advantage of their home turf and fans. Clodfelder hopes the community will be ready to show up in large numbers when the time comes.

"I hope Tiger Nation is excited about another fall football season and makes the road trips as well as comes out to the 'Front Yard' when we are at home..." he explained. "From our team, to the 'Best Band In The Land,' to the cheerleaders, and any other group or organization that is striving to make Paris proud, we ask that they be present and cheer on the young people that put themselves out there."

Tiger Tennis is gunning for the top spot in the LIC

This fall, the Paris Tigers girls tennis team returns five of its top six players from a team that finished 11-6 and claimed second place in the Little Illini Conference (LIC) last season. The Tigers are not settling for number two this time around.

The loss of senior Graci Watson to a season-ending ACL tear stings for Head Coach Stefan Aydt and his crew and will lead to a shakeup of the team's doubles pairings, but Aydt is still confident the group will find success on the court, even with a slew of respected programs (Danville, Mahomet, St. Joseph-Ogden and Gibson City) making their way onto the Tigers' schedule this year.

"I still expect us to be very competitive in most duals and in the LIC, even with our more difficult schedule this season," Aydt told a Prairie Press reporter. "Depending on our sectional assignment, I like our chances of qualifying someone for state."

Aydt, now celebrating his 10th year coaching girls tennis and his 13th season at the helm of the PHS boys tennis program, will have plenty of veteran experience to draw on this season. Emmy Barrett, Bella Moreschi, Myah Bartos, Shelby Fry and Ava Barrett will all look to build on successful campaigns last season. Still, the coach noted several new names are making a push for the top of the lineup, including Kaidence Eveland, Hailey Yantis and Natalie Burger.

"We return five of last year's top six, but we also have a few girls who were lower in the lineup, as well as freshman Paedyn Keys, who are giving these girls a stiff challenge for varsity spots," he explained.

Aydt hopes the mix of experience and youth will be enough to topple Robinson, who took the top spot during the LIC Tournament last season.

"Robinson placed all six girls on the all-conference team last year to take first place, but with four of those girls graduated, and us returning five of six from our second-place team, we're hoping we have a chance to move into that top spot," he said. "But it's always a tough conference, so we'll have to see what everyone looks like this fall."

Claiming the title will require equal parts skill and focus. Aydt's team will look to play smart and focus on accuracy and angles over raw power.

"We won't hit nearly as many winners as some other teams, but our opponents will have to earn every point because our girls never give up on a point and are good at hitting smart, consistent shots," Aydt explained, later adding, "Mentally, we've spent a lot of time in practice talking about needing to practice with the same focus and intensity we want to play matches with."

Fans will have a couple of opportunities to see the Tigers' skills in action at home. Paris is set to host the Paris Doubles Tournament on Saturday, Sept. 21 as well as an IHSA Sectional on the weekend of October 18 and 19. The school's spacious facilities, complete with multiple tennis courts, allowed Paris High School to be considered as a host site.

"Before the new school, we didn't have enough courts, so I believe this will be the first time Paris has hosted a sectional," Aydt said.

T-town, Flora and Olney are all included in Paris' doubles sectional – a trio of programs Aydt believes are "three of the premier girls programs in the southern half of the state." In singles, the Tigers could find themselves pitted against top talent from Danville and Uni High, including two IHSA state finalists.

"Both tournaments will feature high-level talent," Aydt noted.

Whether at the Paris Doubles Tournament or in the postseason, the coach hopes to see the community support his team.

"We love when people come out to watch the matches and support the girls, especially at tournaments," Aydt concluded.

The Tigers open the season on Tuesday, Aug. 27 at Flora High School. Matches begin at 4:30 p.m.


