

Munger Moss Motel will have new owner

A popular Route 66 attraction, Lebanon's Munger Moss Motel has been sold and will remain open to travelers.

Mary Jo Shadel, the daughter of owner Ramona Lehman, confirmed the sale Tuesday.

The new owner is Mark Bertel, CEO of the Dels Corporation of Mountain Home, Ark. Last year, he renovated the old OYO Hotel in Lebanon into apartment space and is working to renovate the old Budget Host Inn Motel as well.

Bertel released a statement Tuesday about his plans for the historic motel. "Our goal at The Dels Corporation is to preserve his-

tory while also adding value to communities," he said. "We are so excited to get the opportunity to work on such a historic landmark as the Munger Moss Motel. We are going to make sure the classic neon sign is preserved and enjoyed by generations to come. We will be keeping all of the Route 66 memorabilia and displaying it for visitors. We plan to update the exterior of the complex and continue the mixed use of Munger Moss. Several units are already set up for long term rentals. We plan to expand that capacity while also providing single night stays for visitors along old route 66. We love Lebanon and can't wait to contribute even more

to your wonderful community."

Shadel said a contract has been signed for the sale. She said the motel will remain open

"Mom and Dad had been there for so long and Mom's health has deteriorated so much she can't do it, and I've got a business to take care of, the old motel just needs some love and attention and that's what they're going to give it, they're going to continue with everything," she said. She said Bertel and his company "do a good job, they love the community. Mom and Dad had already done so much long term rent, efficiency apartments, he's going to expand that a bit and keep the newer units as night-

ly rentals for Route 66 people."

She said she and her sister were sorry they could not continue with the motel, but believes it will be in good hands.

"They're going to make it a nice place again," she said. "It needs lot of work, love and attention and he will do that," she said. "It's going to be something that Lebanon can be proud of."

Ramona and Bob Lehman purchased the historic motel in 1971.

According to the Munger Moss website, the business began with the Munger-Moss Sandwich on U.S. Route 66 in Missouri in about 1936. Located on the Big Piney River at Devil's Elbow, Missouri until

1945, it relocated to Lebanon after World War II when construction of a four-lane bypass of U.S. Route 66 in Missouri to Fort Leonard Wood drew traffic away from the original site.

A Munger Moss Motel was added in 1946 as an addition to the Lebanon roadside restaurant and filling station, both of which are now gone. The restaurant was named for Nelle Munger, its original owner, and her second husband Emmett Moss. This name was retained after the business was sold to Pete and Jesse Hudson in 1945, relocated to the former Chicken Shanty site in Lebanon in September 1945 and expanded with tourist cabins in 1946.

Council approves gateway arch changes

The Lebanon City Council Monday authorized some changes to the gateway arches project planned for Downtown.

City Administrator Michael Schumacher said work is proceeding to begin the project.

"We want to make sure that project's perfect and we want to make sure it reflects the energy downtown and that required some changes to the change order," he said. "It's an unfortunate part of a project, sometimes you get change orders, sometimes some materials are hard to find."

He said changes included the lettering and aluminum behind it.

"The bidder couldn't work with that material and there were some

changes," he said. "It will look the same."

He said lights on top of the arches were removed because of costs.

"We may add those at

a later date, but for now they've been cut," he said.

A \$32,776 change order with Brinkoetter's Iron Works for fabricating and installing aluminum

perforated panels, letters and boxes on the Downtown arches was approved. The city also needed to purchase clam shell bases for the project.

Schumacher said that because of time constraints, quotes were obtained directly from the manufacturers of the clam shell bases to ensure no delays to the project. The clam shell bases will be purchased from Terracast Products, LLC. For \$5,506.

The gateway span of the planned arch is 46 feet and will include the words "Downtown Lebanon" at Jefferson and Commercial.

Downtown Lebanon gets a statewide showcase next week as the city hosts a statewide training session.

Main Street representatives from all over the state of Missouri will come to Lebanon Feb. 22 and 23 to learn about Main Street revitalization.

The Missouri Main Street Connection Director's Meeting and Quarterly Workshop will be held Wednesday and Thursday. The event will include a tour of historic buildings in Downtown Lebanon.

Downtown Business District Executive Director Cynthia Coffman said

it was an honor for Lebanon to be chosen as host for the event. She said the entire community should be proud.

"There are three of these workshops in different towns in Missouri during the year," she said. "The annual conference will be held in St. Louis. Only three towns get chosen each year, Lebanon was picked in large part because we received an award last August as the best community empowerment grant community. It gives us a chance to highlight what we've done. We've received a lot of positive feedback from Missouri Main Street about how much Lebanon has done for its downtown in a short period of time."


Downtown Lebanon will host a statewide training event next week for the State of Missouri's Main Street program. Lebanon's Downtown is a participant in the program.



The costs of the project were split 75/25 with 75 percent of the funding coming from city capital improvement funds and 25 percent coming from the Downtown Business District.

In October, the Lebanon City Council approved the bid of Brinkoetter's Iron Works to deliver and install material for the arches in the amount of \$72,421. The change order is for \$32,776.

According to the change order, it was decided that aluminum panels, letter and boxes will be needed for the arches, along with the clam shell bases, which will cost \$5,506.

The city had expected work to begin in a matter of weeks and it is still

expected to proceed as scheduled, according to City Communications Manager Derek Gean.

In other business, the Council gave first reading approval to an ordinance

amending the city's marijuana codes. The ordinance will need a second reading at the next council meeting to take effect.

Schumacher said the new code is needed be-

cause state voters approved recreational marijuana last November.

"With the passage of Amendment 3, we have to update our ordinance to reflect the new state

law, so that's the process we are going through," he said.

He said most people will probably not notice many changes to the law "because the legalization of marijuana is a new thing in and of itself."

He said the main changes will be where marijuana establishments can and cannot be located.

Marijuana sales are now legal in the city, but marijuana use in public is still prohibited. At a previous meeting, the Council voted to place an issue banning recreational marijuana sales. It will require 60 percent approval from voters to take effect and cannot be held until November 2024.

The Council also approved a lease agreement

with True Construction for a city-owned area behind 214 West Commercial. The area was formerly a loading dock for Family Dollar and will be an outdoor dining area for Boat Town Brewing.

The Council renewed the city's agreement with ArchiveSocial LLC to provide software for social media records. The three-year agreement will cost \$17,065.

The Council approved the purchase of three vehicles for public works, two 2023 Chevrolet pickups, one for the street department and one for the wastewater department for \$44,485 each and one 2022 Ford for public works for \$34,780. All vehicles were purchased from Ed Morse Ford.

Workshop

Mel's on Madison will serve lunch and the group will conduct a walking tour from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. of the downtown business district.

"They will visit buildings that have had work done or have interesting business in them," she said. "It's an hour to walk through downtown and let the other Main Street directors see what we're doing in Lebanon."

This is followed by networking event and dinner at The Rail. The group will then go to Boat Town Brewing for a concert with Dawson Hollow. The concert is not open to the public and is for the directors, staff and Board of

Main Street Connection.

Thursday, the actual workshop will be held. It is set to cover how Main Street groups can create a strategic marketing plan that will help meet their goals. Participants will hear from Kirsten Borgstrom of Place+Main Advisors, a Michigan-based company that works in the areas of economic development, community marketing and communications. She will discuss communications and marketing strategies. The theme will be "telling your Main Street story, marketing your Main Street."

"Even though it's geared toward Main

Street, I think anyone who works in Laclede County, Lebanon or the surrounding communities would benefit from this," she said.

Registration is \$100 per person for Missouri Main Street members. \$200 for non-members. After Feb. 16, add \$50.

About 50 people are expected Wednesday, with at least 100 expected on Thursday.

Longtime Laclede Baptist Association Director of Missions, the Rev. Steven Russell Strauch died Friday in his home. He was 53.

He was born in Jefferson City and spent his early years in Centertown. Strauch graduated from Jefferson High School in the class of 1987 and attended Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar, receiving a Bachelor of Arts in Christian Ministries. From there he attended Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Kansas City, receiving a Master of Divinity.

He pastored churches at Centertown, Clarksburg and Conway, later serving as Director of Missions in Lawrence County.

In addition to serving as Director of Missions he also was manager of the Laclede Baptist Camp. His other ministry po-

sitions included Windmere Baptist Assembly, staff of Missouri Baptist Convention, international missions and other numerous committees.

In a 2021 interview with the Record, he explained his job as director of missions for Southern Baptist churches in the Laclede County area.

"That might involve pastor mentoring, it might involve mission development, disaster relief ministry, and it also includes the camp program we do at Laclede Baptist Camp. I'm kind of a pastor to the pastors," he said.

He was also known for his work as a photographer. He said he enjoyed "getting out there and seeing the sights, and then capturing a moment, a sight that you're used to seeing, but capturing it from a different angle." He was active in the Lebanon community and had a great interest

in family genealogy and German heritage. Strauch enjoyed antique restoration, camping, hiking, trout fishing and a good road trip.

After moving to Lebanon he became a member of Hillcrest Baptist Church.

Services will be held at 11 a.m. Feb. 21 at Hillcrest Baptist Church with visitation from 5-7 p.m. Monday at the church.

Laclede County sheriff honored 158 years after death in the line of duty

The name of a Laclede County Sheriff will be added to the National Law Enforcement Memorial Wall in Washington D.C., 158-years after his line of duty death. The wall honors members of law enforcement killed in the line of duty.

Robert Boone Harris, was killed in the line of duty on May 17, 1865 by Confederate loyalist, after the Civil War had ended. Harris had been appointed Sheriff in Laclede County in 1865. According to historical documents, nearly 46 confederate riders invaded Laclede County on May 17, 1865. The group swept through Laclede, Dallas, Camden, Hickory and Benton Counties. They killed a total of 13-people before they disbanded.

Harris, along with an army officer stationed in Laclede County, was captured and then hung



by the loyalist. Three other riders with Harris were killed. Those three had their throats cut by the group. They captured Harris 10-miles northwest of Lebanon.

"I was contacted by John Dugan, with the Missouri State Archives, and he told me the story. He had run across the documentation and found out Harris was not listed on the state memorial wall or the national wall," Laclede County Sheriff David Millsap said. "We have a list of all Sheriffs who have served Laclede County and his name wasn't on the list. Harris had been appointed to the office and shortly after assuming the position of Sheriff he was killed."

After learning of the information and reviewing the documentation, provided by Dugan, the Sheriff made application to have Harris' name added to the National Law Enforcement Memorial Wall in Washington. The Sheriff has also made application to have Harris' name added to the wall in Jefferson City.

On February 6, 2023 the Sheriff was notified Harris will have his

name placed on the wall on May 13, 2023, at a ceremony in the nation's capital. "We haven't heard from the state about his name being added to the wall in Jefferson City," the Sheriff said.

"Even though his death occurred 158-years ago we wanted to honor his service to Laclede County. He died protecting citizens of this community, and that should be honored, though it has taken 158-years for this to come full circle," Millsap said.

Harris was from Chase County, Kansas and moved to Laclede County prior to the Civil War. He joined the Union Army. He was wounded and had his arm removed as a result of a gunshot. He was discharged from the army and then was appointed Sheriff.

"We don't know of any relatives, other than we have a lead that he may have relatives in Oklahoma," Sheriff Millsap said. There is a plan to have some type of recognition honoring Harris on the wall of the new 911-Communications Building. That building is slated to open in mid-2024.

Additional child sex crime charges filed against Kincheloe

A 44-year-old Lebanon man is facing more charges related to child sex crimes. Thomas Charles Kincheloe, 44, Lebanon is facing additional charges of child molestation.

Kincheloe is charged with child molestation 3rd degree, child less than 14 years old, child molestation second degree, child less than 12 years old; and statutory sodomy, person less than 12 years old in two separate cases.

His arraignment is scheduled for 9 a.m. March 6.

Kincheloe was charged in December of last year with three counts of statutory sodomy or attempted statutory sodomy, deviate sexual intercourse, person less than 12 years old, and one count of

second-degree child molestation of a child less than 12 years old.

The incidents reportedly happened at a home where Kincheloe's wife ran a childcare. Authorities say Kincheloe said the events happened when his wife would leave to go shopping.

Kincheloe was detained and interviewed Thursday, Dec. 29 after

an investigation into allegations of a child sex time against a child less than 10 years old which was reported to both the Lebanon Police Department and the Missouri Department of Social Services-Children's Division.

According to a probable cause statement from the Lebanon Police Department, an 11-year-old and 9-year-old told officers Kincheloe inappropriately touched and groped children while wrestling and tickling them.

Another probable cause statement says a 10-year-old girl told officers Kincheloe touched her inappropriately in a private area.

Kincheloe told investigators he was close to the girl, but said, "the intent was there but I didn't go through with it."

LMS robotics team to compete at state

Lebanon Middle School's robotics team will compete at state championships March 4.

Bryan Barker, one of the coaches for the LMS Buzzbots, said the students have worked hard to achieve this success.

Many hours have been put into designing and building a competitive robot, he said.

"We are competing in a High School dominated event, we are not the only Middle School but we are one of the few," he said. "Leading up to the League Tournament we competed in three meets, where we competed in six different rounds. Each of those rounds we received points. The top ten meet rounds, those points followed us to the League Tournament."

The Buzzbots team went into the Tournament in 12th place.

"At the tournament, we scored very well with the team called Sigma. Sigma is a High School team from Central High School in Springfield. Sigma finished the tournament in 2nd place, so they got to choose two teams to go into the finals," Barker said.

The finals were an elimination bracket where only the winning teams advanced. Sigma chose their sister team CPU and LMS Buzzbots to be their alliances team, to go into the finals. The team of Sigma, CPU, and

Buzzbots went undefeated and advanced to the MO/KS Championships. The championships will be held March 4 in Rolla at Missouri S&T.

The team earned the "Winning Alliance" trophy with their three-team alliance with Springfield Sigma. They are one of five teams advancing to the MOKS State Championship.

Robotics Coach Valorie Hopkins said this year's team was composed of five students from each grade, sixth, seventh and eighth.

"Our returning team members from last year have led the team all year. We typically meet once a week after school. Each year a new "game" format is announced in September. We spend the next four months planning, designing, building, and revising the robot," Hopkins said.

Hopkins said the best thing about First Tech Challenge is that teams do not only count on their own robot.

"Each match two teams are randomly paired as an alliance team," she said. "Your two robots work together to score the most points during the three-part playing session. For the first 30 seconds, robots run in autonomous mode where kids write computer codes to try to score. The next two and a half minutes, the robots are controlled by a "driver". This requires a

student to use a handheld controller to run all parts of the robot. In the last 30 seconds a "human" player introduces more scoring elements where bonus opportunities happen."

She said the alliance team changes every

match. This requires collaboration and adjustments between each round of play. Students learn communication, problem-solving and professionalism.

"Mentors act only as advisers to the students and we are proud that

our team handles the robot work, portfolio, and fundraising mostly on their own," she said. "We are lucky to have some local donors and corporate sponsors, but we always need more financial support if anyone in the community is

looking to get involved."

She said LMS is excited to make their first live appearance at the Missouri-Kansas finals. "During the pandemic, our LMS team made it to a virtual state event but that seemed much different," she said.

It might seem like a broken record at this point. Still, the Lebanon High School girls' wrestling team has continued to run through their competition and captured a fifth straight district championship on Saturday afternoon at Ozark High School.

For LHS, they have won a district championship in all five years that girls' wrestling has been a sponsored sport by the Missouri State High School Activities Association. The 2022-23 season is the first year it has been split into two classes, giving the Lady 'Jackets their first Class 2 District 3 title.

During the tournament, Lebanon won first place with 224 team points scored, while Nixa was in second with 194 team points, and Belton rounded out the top three with 156 points.

Head coach Matt Neely was proud of his team's performance at the district tournament.

"It's always enjoyable to win another district title," he stated. "It's proof to the girls that their hard work pays off, especially when we have high-caliber teams like Nixa and Belton in our district."

The Lady 'Jackets will send nine wrestlers to the MSHSAA Class 2 State tournament that will begin on Friday, Feb. 24, and conclude on Saturday, Feb. 25, at Mizou Arena in Columbia.

With the top four advancing through, the Lady 'Jackets qualified Jessa Joiner, Halea Bartel, Bailey Joiner, Mariyah Brumley, MaKenna Lucas, Taylor Johnson, Adeline Cottongim, Lillian Cottongim, and Andrea Childress.

District champions:
Jessa Joiner (1st place) 110-pounds — Joiner defeated Jazlyn Smith-Freeman (Smith-Cotton) via Tech Fall (20-4) and improved to 46-1 on the season. She is currently ranked No. 1 at 110-pounds in Class 2.

Halea Bartel (1st place) 125-pounds — Bartel won by major decision over Addison Harkins (Nixa) via Major Decision and improved to 41-3 on the year. According to Missouri Wrestling, she is ranked No. 1 at 125-pounds in Class 2.

Bailey Joiner (1st place) 145-pounds — Joiner was victorious over Louise Juitt (Belton) by Major Decision (11-3) and improved to 41-5 on the season. She is ranked No. 4 at 140-pounds in Class 2 but will be wrestling at 145 at the state tournament.

Mariyah Brumley (1st place) 190-pounds — Brumley won another district championship and defeated Harmony Moore (Willard) via pin at the 1:52 mark. Brumley improved her record to 44-2 and is ranked No. 2 at 190 pounds.

"Jessa, Halea, Bailey, and Mairyah always come prepared to compete their best," said Neely. "Each practice they are willing to put the work in, and it's evidenced by their results."

Other State qualifiers: Makenna Lucas (2nd place) 235-pounds — Lucas fell in the semifinal round against Larissa Downs (Nixa) by a score of 5-0 before losing to Catherine Dutton (Willard) due to injury default. Lucas will sport a 29-6 record heading to Columbia.

Taylor Johnson (2nd place) 135-pounds — Johnson lost to Bren-



ya Crahan (Nixa) in the championship via fall at 3:41. Johnson is a William Woods commit and is 37-6 on the season and will hope to win another state medal.

Adeline Cottongim (2nd place) 115-pounds — Cottongim is 20-5 on the season and lost to Kelsey Watts (Nixa) by injury default. She won over Kaitlyn DuBois (Belton) via pin in the semifinal round.

Lillian Cottongim (3rd place) 105-pounds — Cottongim is ranked No. 4 at 105 pounds and fell to Emily Price (Ozark) in the semifinal round. She bounced back in a big way with a pin over Jaidyn Pohlsander (Central) in the 3rd place match.

Andrea Childress (3rd place) 140-pounds — Childress is a first-time state qualifier with a third-place finish at 140 pounds. She beat Mad-die Welch (Ray-Pec) via fall in 22 seconds before
